



A partnership agreement between the
AMERICAN SOCIETY FOR ENGINEERING EDUCATION
and the

INTERNATIONALE GESELLSCHAFT FÜR INGENIEURPÄDAGOGIK
for the publication of the
JOURNAL OF ENGINEERING EDUCATION
in Europe

PREAMBLE

The Internationale Gesellschaft für Ingenieurpädagogik (IGIP) and the American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE) form this partnership to further the advancement of global engineering excellence through the publication of the *Journal of Engineering Education* (JEE) in Europe. The principal benefits anticipated are: (1) increased membership and member involvement in IGIP by offering JEE as an exclusive member benefit and cost effective access to scholarly engineering education research for IGIP members; (2) increased readers, authors, and reviewers for JEE from Europe and an opportunity to share global advancements in engineering education research between IGIP and ASEE; and (3) increased awareness between IGIP and ASEE of the aspirations of each other's societies and the potential for further mutual collaborations to advance those aspirations.

ARTICLES OF COOPERATION

In the spirit of partnership and mutual collaboration, IGIP and ASEE agree to the following.

1. **PROPRIETARY PARTNERSHIP:** IGIP will be the proprietary multi-national engineering education society in Europe offering JEE as a member benefit. ASEE will not enter into similar arrangements with other multi-national engineering education societies or organizations in Europe without the approval of IGIP. JEE will be the proprietary international engineering education journal offered as a benefit to IGIP members. IGIP will not enter into similar arrangements with other international engineering education journals without the approval of ASEE. An exception is the prior agreement between IGIP and the Société Européenne pour la Formation des Ingénieurs (SEFI) to offer the *European Journal of Engineering Education* as a benefit to IGIP members.
2. **REVENUES:** The subscription price will be expressed separately as an addendum to this agreement as mutually agreed by each society. It is desired that the journal be priced marginally above the cost of production and mailing. Any net revenues generated by IGIP subscribers will be shared equally between the two societies.
3. **PRODUCTION:** It is anticipated that the majority of the subscribers will be within Europe; however, there may be some subscribers in neighboring regions and countries. Copies of JEE will be produced according to the same specifications as produced for ASEE members.
4. **SUBSCRIBERS:** IGIP will promote JEE as a benefit among its members on an ongoing basis. IGIP will maintain an up-to-date record of the IGIP subscribers to JEE and will provide a current list of subscribers quarterly to a JEE designated printer. IGIP will reimburse ASEE quarterly for the IGIP subscribers.
5. **STAFFING:** IGIP and ASEE will appoint a member of their office staffs to serve as a point of contact for the editorial office of JEE, the membership of their respective societies on issues related to JEE, and others in their nations and nearby countries or regions who express an interest in JEE.
6. **BOARD REPRESENTATION:** JEE will allocate one position on the JEE Advisory Board for a representative from IGIP. IGIP is responsible for nominating individuals for consideration and selection by the JEE editor.
7. **WEB PRESENCE:** IGIP will provide and maintain an appropriate presence and link to the JEE Web site on the IGIP Web site, and ASEE will provide and maintain an appropriate presence and link to the IGIP publications page on the ASEE Web site.
8. **TERM OF AGREEMENT:** This agreement will be effective upon the signature of both societies and it shall remain in effect until it is either terminated by mutual consent of both societies or by one society giving six months written advance notice to the other.
